Dear Parents,

September brings a lot of events and academics in class becoming a bit more rigorous as we solidify procedures in class. Please do your part by volunteering with school events when your are able and supporting your child at home by talking about what is happening at school, supporting homework procedures and reading to (and with) your child on a regular basis.

Our LCC PTA does so many great things for kids at our school and it is that time of the year when they reach out to families to join the LCC PTA organization. Parents often ask, "What can I do to help my child at home?" This week, I would like you to practice skip counting by 2's, 5,s and 10's with them. Also, practice identifying the time on a standard clock (not digital). This will help students as we work on learning how to solve problems with elapsed time (the amount of time that passes from one point to another). The skip counting is a quick and easy task that can be completed while driving home, sitting at home or waiting to order at a restaurant. For some of us, finding a traditional clock may be a challenge. Your child has a handmade clock in their homework folder just in case.
